

Level 2 Restrictions – COVID Update

Belmont North Public School is currently operating under level 2 of COVID-Safe School Operations. (See attached)

In Summary:

- All approved visitors must report directly to the office (Please phone ahead) to sign an external visitor register and sign in using the QR code (evidenced to admin staff).
- All parents/visitors must wear a mask on entering the school site
- A visitor's sticker must be worn while on site (this will confirm you have followed the protocols at the office for staff members on site).
- Assemblies can be held with COVID-Safe practices in place outdoors. No visitors permitted.
- Singing, chanting, group repetition and choirs are permitted if conducted outside in a well ventilated area. No choirs or large groups of singing indoors.
- Bands and ensembles are permitted in line with Health advice on maximum indoor and outdoor gatherings.
- Dance or drama are permitted in line with COVID-safe practices.
- Please continue to keep your children home if they are feeling unwell. This must be communicated to the school to ensure the correct protocols are in place.



Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD).

NCCD Processes

Belmont North Public School, along with all Australian schools, is required to participate annually in the National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) on School Students with Disability. This collection of data will assist us in ensuring all students take part in all school activities on the same basis as students without a disability.

Belmont North Public School is dedicated to ensuring all students have effective and differentiated learning programs to ensure all students have the ability to succeed at school.

By law schools are required to make reasonable adjustments where needed to assist students with disability. These responsibilities are outlined in the *Disability Discrimination Act* 1992 and the *Disability Standards for Education 2005*. At Belmont North Public School learning adjustments could be in the form of extra time to finish tasks, small group instructions, 1:1 support time, Learning and Support Teacher assistance or physical adjustments made to the environment to better support students. Students do not need to have a diagnosed disability to receive learning adjustments, however students receiving these do come under the National Consistent Collection of Data.

These learning adjustments are significant to their learning program and assist their learning style. Should you wish to discuss adjustments that might benefit your child please talk to your child's class teacher.

The NSW Department of Education will provide data to the Australian Government from all NSW public schools in such a way that no individual student or school will be able to be identified. In this way, we will ensure the privacy and confidentiality of all students.

The National Consistency Collection of Data (NCCD) will not affect your child in any way and they will not be required to undertake any additional testing.
